Overdose Lifeline is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to helping individuals, families, and communities affected by the disease of substance use disorder.

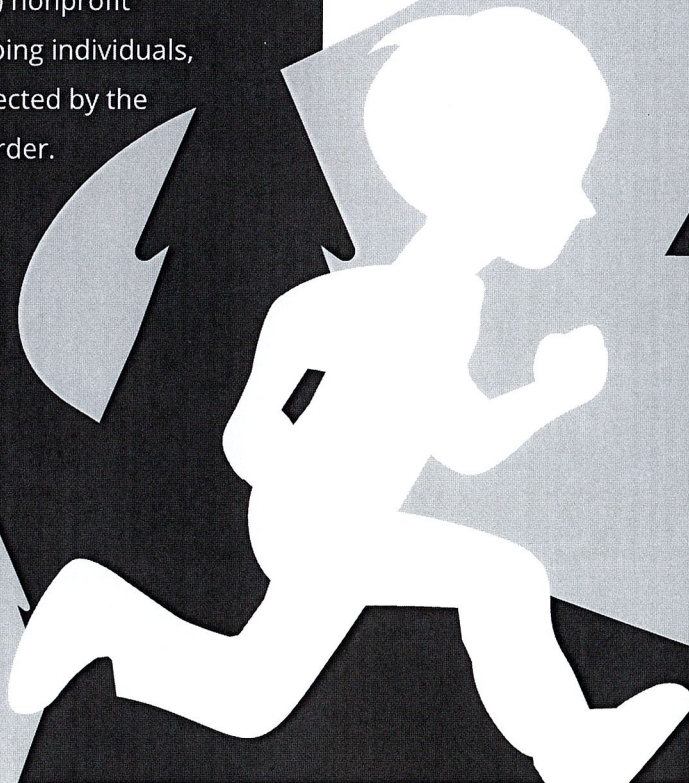

ABOUT THE CAMP

Camp Mariposa—Aaron’s Place is a year-round free weekend camp program for children ages 9-12 who are affected by the substance use disorder of a family member. These weekend camps offer fun, traditional camp activities combined with education and support sessions led by mental health professionals and trained adult mentors.

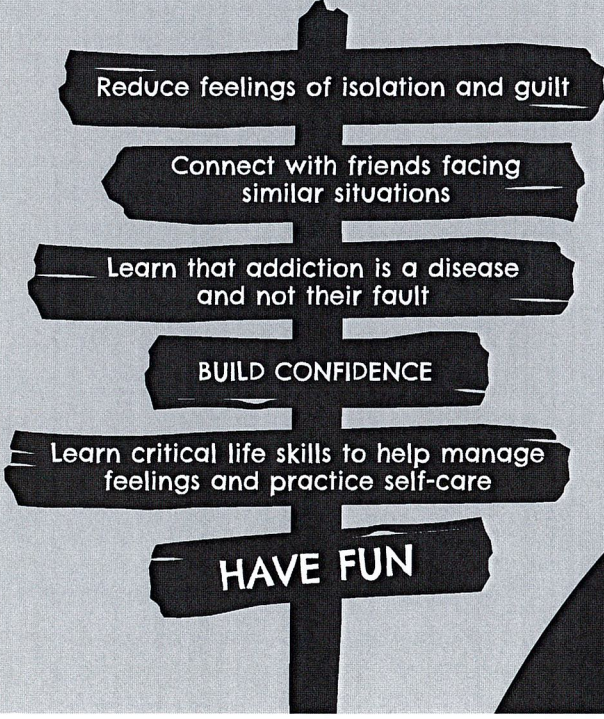
Jameson Camp, Indianapolis, IN:
