MARITIME ACADEMY GRADUATES

Thanks to our partnerships with federal and state maritime academies across the country, students can earn a 4-year degree and seamlessly transfer to a licensed job on one of our ships.

UNLICENSED ENTRY-LEVEL POSITIONS

No experience necessary! MSC provides all the training and guidance a new mariner needs.

SUPPLY UTILITYMAN | \$69K*

Duties include food handling and preparation, serving meals, bussing tables, as well as cleaning of the ship.

WIPER | \$70K*

Duties include cleaning and preservation of engine department spaces, systems and equipment.

ORDINARY SEAMAN | \$65K*

Duties include general maintenance, repair and sanitation, and upkeep of material and equipment on the deck.

ENTRY-LEVEL LICENSED POSITIONS

Take that degree to the next level!

3RD OFFICER | \$156K*

Supports the Master and senior deck officers, and in their absence may assume command of the ship.

3RD ASSISTANT ENGINEER | \$190K*

Oversees machinery, logs data, and reports any notable events for safe and efficient operations of the ship.

JUNIOR SUPPLY OFFICER | \$134K*

Oversees ship supplies and logistics, managing operations, personnel, and communication across diverse vessels and management levels.

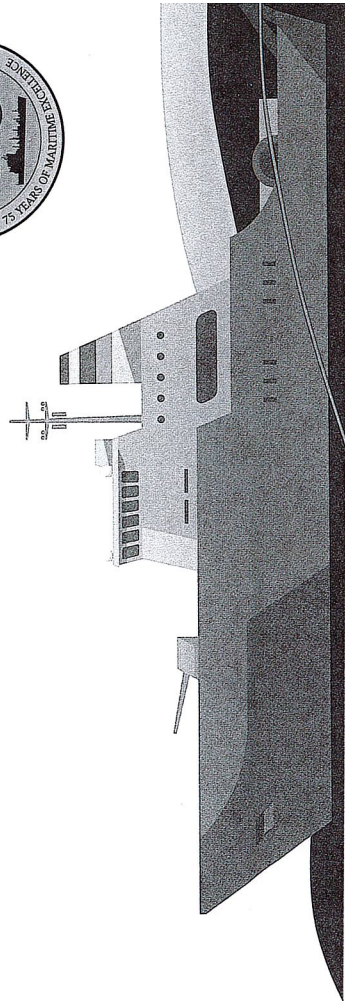

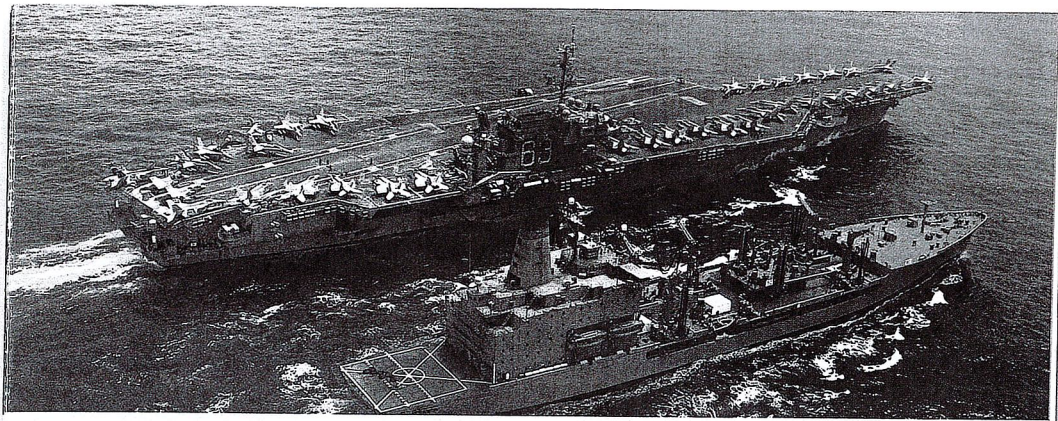

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

If you desire steady employment, great pay, federal benefits and the opportunity to see the world while serving your country, consider a career with MSC. To be considered, all applicants must meet the following conditions of employment:

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Be a United States citizen with a valid U.S. Tourist Passport with a minimum of seven months remaining prior to expiration.
- Hold and maintain a Transportation Workers Identification Card (TWIC) and/or Department of Defense (DOD) Common Access Card (CAC) with a minimum of ten months remaining prior to expiration. Learn more about the TWIC & CAC at sealiftcommand.com/resources.
- Hold and maintain a Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC) issued by the United States Coast Guard to mariners sailing aboard all U.S. Flagged Vessels with a minimum of ten months remaining before expiration. Learn more about the MMC at sealiftcommand.com/resources. When obtaining your medical screening for your MMC application, please use form CG 719K.
- Be capable of passing an MSC-administered physical examination. Due to often strenuous shipboard duties and extended periods at sea, all applicants must meet MSC medical requirements. Any applicants applying for positions that would require them to work aloft will be required to meet specific weight restrictions in order to be considered for employment as a CIVMAR. (Human Resources Advisory 2013 - 3 Physical Requirements for - Personnel in Connection with the use of FPAS).
- Be drug free and submit to urinalysis in accordance with the Department of Health and Human Services guidelines. View Medical Standards at sealiftcommand.com/about-msc/medical-standards.
- Be able to obtain and maintain a security clearance. View E-Verify at sealiftcommand.com/about-msc/e-verify.
- Be capable of speaking, understanding, reading and writing the English language. Some positions are required to pass an English Language Competency test.
- Certain positions are required to be eligible to have access to, handle and be qualified in small arms in accordance with OPNAVINST 3591.1.

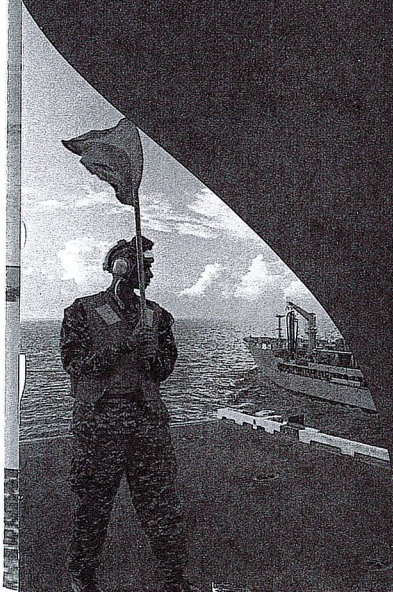
MILITARY SEALIFT COMMAND (MSC)?



They've got a fleet of 60+ ships run by civilian crews, doing vital stuff like refueling, moving military supplies worldwide, and pulling off specialized missions for the Department of Defense.

THE REALLY COOL PART? The people running these missions, known as civil service mariners (CIVMARS), aren't active duty military - they're federal employees.

HARD WORK, BIG REWARD. MSC CIVMARS work on United States Naval Supply (USNS) warships, making sure things run smoothly globally, handling logistics, and tackling dedicated operations.
