Community:

- The town of Orleans was created in 1815 and named to commemorate the Battle of New Orleans
- Jenkins Place and Orleans Historic District are listed on the National Register of Historic Places
- Approximately 2,125 people live in the town
- Most people are farmers or blue collar workers.
- Major industries in the area include ISI, Paoli, Inc., White Castle, and Reynolds, Inc.
- Orange County tourist attractions are the French Lick Springs Resort & Casino and Ski Paoli Peaks.

School:

- Located one block west of State Road 37, an hour south of Bloomington, IN
- One of three high schools located in Orange County and has an enrollment of approximately 400 students in grades 7-12
- Offers 89 courses to students in grades 9-12, unweighted
- Offers 8 CTE pathways
- A 1:1 Chromebook school
- Calendar: 2 semesters, 180 instructional days with Block 8 scheduling
- Class of 2022: Expect 32% to earn AHD and 68% to earn Core 40

Graduation Requirements (Beginning with the Class of 2023):

- 2. Learn and demonstrate Employability Skills (Complete one of the following):
 - Project-Based Experience
 - Service-Based Experience
 - Work-Based Experience
- 3. Postsecondary-Ready Competencies (Complete one of the following):
 - o Academic Honors Diploma
 - SAT: Reading/Writing=480, Math=530
 - ACT: English=18, Reading=22, Math=22, Science=23 (2 out of 4 needed with at least one in English/Reading and one in Math/Science)
 - o ASVAB: 31+
 - CTE Concentrator: C average or higher in at least two advanced HS courses in a state-approved CTE pathway
 - AP/DC: C average or higher in 3 courses (1 of 3 must be in core content area or all three must be part of a CTE pathway)
 - Waiver

Core 40 Diploma

Students must earn a minimum of 40 credits to graduate which must include:

•	English	4 years	8 credits
•	Math	3 years	6 credits
•	Science	3 years	6 credits
•	Social Studies	3 years	6 credits
•	Physical Education	1 year	2 credits
•	Health and Wellness	.5 years	1 credit
•	Directed Electives	2.5 years	5 credits
•	Electives	3 years	6 credits

Core 40 with Academic Honors Diploma (AHD)

Complete all requirements for Core 40 in addition to:

- Minimum of 47 credits
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits (6 credits in one or 4 credits each in two languages)
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma
- Have a GPA of a "B" or better
- Complete <u>one</u> of the following:
 - o Earn 4 credits in two or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
 - Earn 6 verifiable transcripted college credits in dual credit courses from the approved dual credit
 - Earn the following:
 - A minimum of 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the approved dual credit list
 - 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams
 - Earn a composite score of 1250 or higher on the SAT and a minimum of 560 in math and 590 on the EBRW
 - Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete the written section

In addition, Class of 2022 students must meet the minimum standard on each section of the ISTEP+/Graduation Qualifying Exam or meet the minimum standard of Indiana Graduation Pathways. Minimum standards are established by the Indiana Department of Education.
